The versatility and power of today's DSLRs have literally revolutionized nature photography, but for George Lepp each new advance fuels creative vision and moves us closer to the limitless photographic environment he craves. In this program, George shares the capture techniques and technology he's developing and using right now, in the wild and in the studio, including achieving unlimited depth of field in ultra-high-magnification studies and panoramic landscapes; conveying action through time and space with action sequence panoramas; capturing intimate wildlife studies with extreme telephoto camera/lens combinations; mastering time-lapse and stop action; and maximizing the power of 4K Video for motion and single-frame extraction.

One of North America's best-known contemporary outdoor and nature photographers and a leader in the field of digital imaging, Lepp is the author of many books and the field editor of Outdoor Photographer magazine, where his "Tech Tips" column is widely read. His work is extensively published and exhibited, and his stock photography is represented by Getty Images, Corbis, and Photo Researchers. Lepp is one of the first members of Canon USA's "Explorers of Light" and Printmasters programs, which fea-

tures the industry's most influential photographers. He has presented hundreds of lectures and led workshops all over the world, and often serves as a judge of international photography competitions. Lepp is a founder and fellow of the North American Nature Photographers Association (NANPA) and has won many awards for his work, including the Photographic Society of America's prestigious Progress Award. First trained in wildlife and wildlands management, Lepp later earned a BA and an honorary Master of Science degree from Brooks Institute of Photography. Creating Dynamic Images to Please Yourself -The Road from Journalism to Fine Art This is a creative lecture about the highlights and frustrations of 35 years shooting journalism, corporate, advertising and now fine art. Sitting still won't bring in new ideas; experimenting and trying new things will jog your creativity. Practice, practice, practice. Creativity is like a muscle that you need to flex regularly. In much the same way that our bodies get out of shape without using our muscles, as a photographer our cognitive and visual capabilities decrease if we don't try new things. We must push boundaries to succeed and continue pushing boundaries even when there seems that there are no more to push.

Here Seth will seek to balance the idea of a visual voice "vision" and a creative look "style" which together are the voice of a photographer.





BIOGRAPHY

Seth Resnick has made his mark in the world of contemporary photography with a prolific career spanning education, fine art, editorial, stock and commercial work, as well his entrepreneurial contributions in training thousands of photographers in digital workflow. Chosen by *Photo District News* as one of the 30 most influential photographers of the decade, Seth is greatly in demand for his beautiful graphic images in both natural and created light. Resnick has been published in many of the world's most prestigious magazines. His credits include over 2500 publications worldwide and his clients constitute a virtual "Who's Who" list of Corporate America.

He is co-founder of D-65, an organization teaching digital workflow workshops, webinars, one-on-one training, tech support, and consulting for photographers, studios, agencies, and corporate art departments.

Resnick is also a co-founder of Digital Photo Destinations, an organization that combines exotic world travel with photographic education. As a digital innovation consultant, Resnick works with Adobe, Nikon, X-rite, Epson, NEC, and others to help them formulate more useful products for photographers. Resnick was one of 50 photographers worldwide first named as a Canon "Explorer of Light." He is a member of the prestigious X-rite Colorati program as well as an Alpha/Beta and feature consultant for Adobe Photoshop and-Lightroom and the Ilford Masters Program.

He travels extensively presenting the various aspects of photography, and was the Founding President of Editorial Photographers,

a trade organization dedicated to the promotion of sound business practices for editorial photography. He is also a partner of Pixel-Genius, which is developing Photoshop plug-ins and software for Adobe.

Resnick is a regular contributing columnist to a variety of trade publications. He has given hundreds of lectures to industry organizations such as American Society of Media Photographers (ASMP), Advertising Photographers of America (APA), Professional Photographers of America (PPA), Advertising Photographers of New York (APNY), and various colleges and universities.




GARY CRABBE

The Right Light: Understanding Natural Light for Landscapes and Details One of the hallmarks of an experienced photographer is not only knowing which photos to take, but conversely knowing which photos not to take. Understanding the basics of camera operation and composition can aid in helping improve our photography, but nothing will jumpstart the road to quality image making as much as understanding light and how to use it in your frame. Also as important is knowing how to match the right light with the right subjects, whether that's shooting large grand landscapes or more intimate natural details. We'll learn about the different types of natural lighting conditions and how developing your understanding of one of the most fundamentally important aspects of photography will dramatically improve your image creation process.



BIOGRAPHY

Gary began taking pictures while in college, where he studied Psychology and received his Master's Degree in Directing, Acting, and Writing for the Theater. It was there he started shooting stage productions using black and white film. After gradua-



tion, a twist of fate led Gary to the studio of renowned photographer Galen Rowell, where he managed the 400,000 image library and Stock Department of Mountain Light Photography for nine years. In 1999, he turned to his own photography when he opted to become a stay-at-home dad following the birth of his first child.

Since then, his client and publication credits include the National Geographic Society, New York Times, Forbes Magazine, TIME, Victoria's Secret, The North Face, Sunset, L.L. Bean, Subaru, and The Nature Conservancy. He has seven books to his credit, including the award-winning The California Coast. Other titles include Our San Francisco, Yosemite & the Eastern Sierra, Backroads of the California Wine Country, Backroads of the California Coast, and Greetings from California. His latest book is Photographing California; Vol. 1 – North, won the highly distinguished 2013 Benjamin Franklin Gold Medal Award as Best Regional Title by the Independent Book Publishers Association (IBPA).

Gary's photographic prints and murals are included in both private and corpo-

rate collections. Gary has also conducted highly praised shows and workshops for groups like R.E.I., The Sierra Club, The Photographic Society of America, local camera clubs, and at Point Reyes National Seashore. Gary also offers a variety of other services, including consulting, photo editing and research, public presentations and lectures, along with custom private and group photo workshops.

I started with Santa Fe Photographic workshops, and from there to private instructors and workshops all around the globe.



Revealed by Light: The Art and Magic of Lightbox Photography



In 2016, Lucy won 2nd place for photography in a statewide competition for 2D art at the Triton Museum in Santa Clara and was on exhibition there for 7 weeks.

She is an exhibiting member in the Moraga Art Gallery, and was accepted into a juried exhibition at the Mendocino Art Center in September of 2016 and has been invited back for this year.

In June 2017, Lucy was a featured artist at the Orinda Library, Orinda, CA and has been a featured artist in retail stores, and other public spaces.

Ms. Beck is an active member in the Contra Costa Camera Club, competing at the Master's Level in Pictorial Prints.

Starting with a blank canvas, I will show in this presentation how we can use technique to support artistry in flower photography. Part of this presentation will be in Keynote, and part as a demonstration.

Introduction will include my inspirations and my motivations for doing this kind of photography.

Realizing that the goal is create beautiful pictures, the first step will look at elements of floral design on a flat surface with examples of each element and then how to put them together into a pleasing and artistic picture.

Following this segment, I will arrange flowers on a lightbox in a variety of ways, showing possibilities for different compositions.

I will use Keynote to demonstrate the process of photographing an arrangement.



Stimulating Side Trips: Unfamiliar **Excursions** from Familiar Destinations



Get off the beaten track to make intriguing and original photos! This program will show you lesser-known places you can visit after you have spent time in wellknown photo sites, such as traveling fifteen minutes to an hour to outlying parts of famous cities, or an hour or two from a popular area to someplace quite different and just as interesting. If you're on your own with an ordinary guidebook or on an ordinary sightseeing tour of an area, you are likely to photograph only the familiar places.

BIOGRAPHY

Joseph Hearst is retired from the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory where he worked as a physicist for 35 years. Towards the end of his career he worked mainly in geophysical well logging. He was a founder and past President of

the Minerals and Geotechnical Logging Society. He is a co-author of the book Well Logging for Physical Properties.

After retirement loe took up serious photography and is a member of the Livermore Valley Camera Club and the Contra Costa Camera Club. He is past President of the Northern California Council of Camera Clubs. He administers a study group for the Electronic Image Division of The Photographic Society of America (PSA), and is Director of the PSA Print of the Month competition and past Chair of the Yerba Buena Chapter of PSA.

In 2007 he was elected to the Honor of Associate of PSA (APSA). In 2009 he was awarded the Distinction of Proficient (PPSA), and in 2015 he was elected to the Honor of Fellow of PSA (FPSA). Twenty of his articles have


been published in the PSA Journal, and two portfolios have been published in the British magazine Digital Photo Art. In 2009 he received the Charles Keaton Memorial Award in recognition of his PSA publications. He made a presentation, "Rust, Rub-

bish, and Reflections" at the PSA 2008 Annual Conference, and another presentation, "The Innovative Image," at the 2014 Annual Conference. In 2012 he passed the PSA course "Judging Beyond the Rules" and is now a "qualified judge." In March of 2013 his work was chosen for the Distinctive Image feature of the PSA Journal, and in September he received the Pictorial Print Division Service Medal.

Joe is a docent emeritus at Point Lobos State Reserve in California, one of the most photogenic places in the world.

He has studied with, among others, Freeman Patterson and Richard Martin, has taken a course in Miksang photography, and has been greatly influenced by the work of Ernst Haas.



Drones: A Great New Tool for Photographers



Unmanned aerial vehicles, or drones (as they are commonly known) have become an outstanding choice for serious photographers who want to put a camera in a place they cannot physically go. They have become simple to fly, exceptionally safe, and possess outstanding built-in cameras. Picture a 12 to 20 mega-pixel camera that is fully configurable and controllable that you can position a mile away and high overhead. The same cameras will provide ultra-high definition video on command.

> This presentation will cover the range of flying cameras currently available, the FAA rules for flying them, the simplicity of operating them, and examples of the amazing images you can capture.




